#### **Course Content**

- 1. Idiomatic expressions and vocabulary needed for basic "everyday" conversational situations.
- 2. Grammar: Review of the sounds of diphthongs and division of words into syllables. Review of linking and word stress. Irregular verbs having i-stem preterites. Uses of the present participle. Position of object pronouns with the present participle. Se used as an indefinite subject. Pronouns used as objects of prepositions. Cardinal numerals. Ordinal numerals. Dates.
  - a. Irregular verbs having u-stem preterits. Verbs with changes in spelling in the preterit tense and in formal commands. Combinations of two personal object pronouns. Demonstrative pronouns. Uses of volver and devolver, and of the idiom acabar de.
  - b. The past participle. The present perfect and pluperfect indicative tenses. The past participle uses as an adjective. Summary of other use of haber. Hace meaning ago, since. Forms of oir.
- 3. Short readings from texts with corresponding exercises-both written and oral.
