Course Objectives

	Upon satisfactory completion of the course, students will be able to:
1.	Further able to speak and understand simple Spanish.
2.	Have mastered basic pronunciation and grammatical concepts.
3.	Further understand the vocabulary provided in readings and demonstrate knowledge through dictation tests with 90% accuracy for an A.
4.	Read aloud, and the instructor will evaluate his pronunciation and grade his performance, and the instructor will evaluate and grade his pronunciation. Pronunciation will be further evaluated based on "Pronunciation Guidelines" included in the text. Pronunciation with 90% accuracy for an A.
5.	Further demonstrate speaking skills by oral presentations, evaluated and graded by the instructor. Grading for 90% accuracy based on use of vocabulary, idioms and grammatical structures in the chapter. Pronunciation graded as for number 2 above.
6.	Further write original dialogues based upon materials (vocabulary, idioms, grammar) of the chapter. Graded by the instructor for 90% accuracy.

Course Content

- 1. Idiomatic expressions and vocabulary needed for social and business conversational situations.
- 2. Grammar. The future indicative tense, the conditional indicative tense, verbs irregular in the future and conditional tenses, uses of the future tense, uses of the conditional tense, the future and conditional for probability or conjecture, forms of jugar, and the use of the neuter object pronoun to complete a sentence.
 - a. Stem-changing verbs, irregular preterit tesne of traer, familiar singular commands of irregular, stem-changing and reflexive verbs, irregular comparison of adjectives and adverbs, the absolute superlative, summary of comparison of equality, possessive adjectives that follow the noun and the special use of the indirect object.
 - b. The present subjunctive tense of regular verbs, the present subjunctive tense of irregular verbs, the present subjunctive tense of stem-changing verbs, theory of the subjunctive mood, the subjunctive in noun clauses after verbs expressing wish, request, advice, cause, suggestion or command.
- 3. Short readings from texts with corresponding exercises both written and oral.
