This course is intended as a precursor to SPAN-282 (Introduction to Hispanic Literature), providing much-needed historical and cultural background for students interested in pursuing a Spanish degree at NVC and beyond. Students will be exposed to a variety of culturally and linguistically authentic materials such as films, newspaper articles, biographies, music, and literature in order to make cross-cultural comparisons based on their own cultural interests and curiosities. It is intended to serve as a bridge between two key student demographics: Spanish-learners who have advanced beyond intermediate and advanced language courses and students who are fluent in Spanish but need more cultural and historical background before studying literature in Spanish.

This course is devoted to the study of examples of Hispanic cultures from pre-Columbian times to the present, including the early civilizations, the colonial period, the struggles for independence, the modern period, and Hispanics in the U.S. The course is conducted entirely in Spanish. - "La colonia y las independencias" ("The Colonies and their Independence"): unit on the battles for independence and their legacy in Latin America.
- "Las culturas hispanas en los siglo XX y XXI" ("Hispanic Cultures in the 20th and 21st Centuries"): unit on key political and cultural topics in modern Latin America and Spain.
- "Presentaciones sobre el mundo hispano" ("Presentations on the Hispanic World"): student presentations on selected Hispanic countries.
